The purpose of this “Australian Lifesaving Boat Emergency Rescue Training” (ALBERT) program is to:

- Prioritise the recruitment and development of skilled IRB Drivers and Crews in Surf Life Saving Clubs
- Support development of support operations and expand RWC/Other rescue craft training
- Conduct drill based training that improves the skills and response capabilities of Lifesavers for rescues in various surf conditions, under challenging scenarios on a variety of beaches, with various resources
- Develop cross Club, multi-resource and integrated search and rescue capability
- Build strong cross Club relationships using the IRB to establish a broader collective and interoperable resource to assist lifesaving service delivery across the region.
- Discuss, explore and trial within SOP safety requirements, new possible methods for SAR activities.
