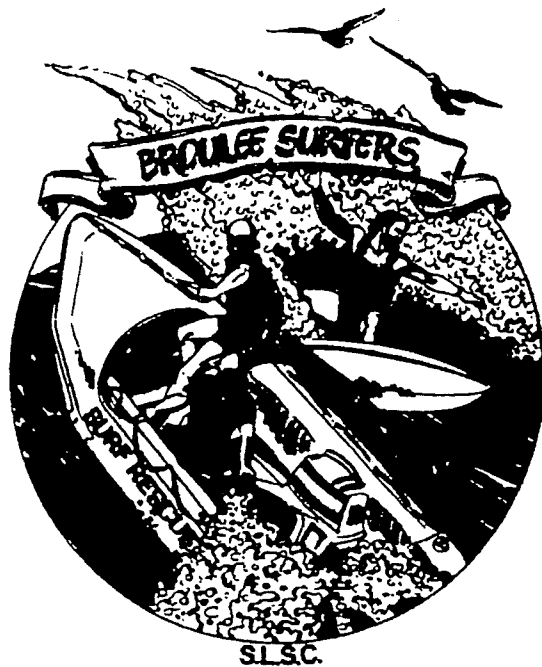

I would like to take this opportunity to thank members, families and friends and sponsors for your support and we look forward to a bigger and better coming year.

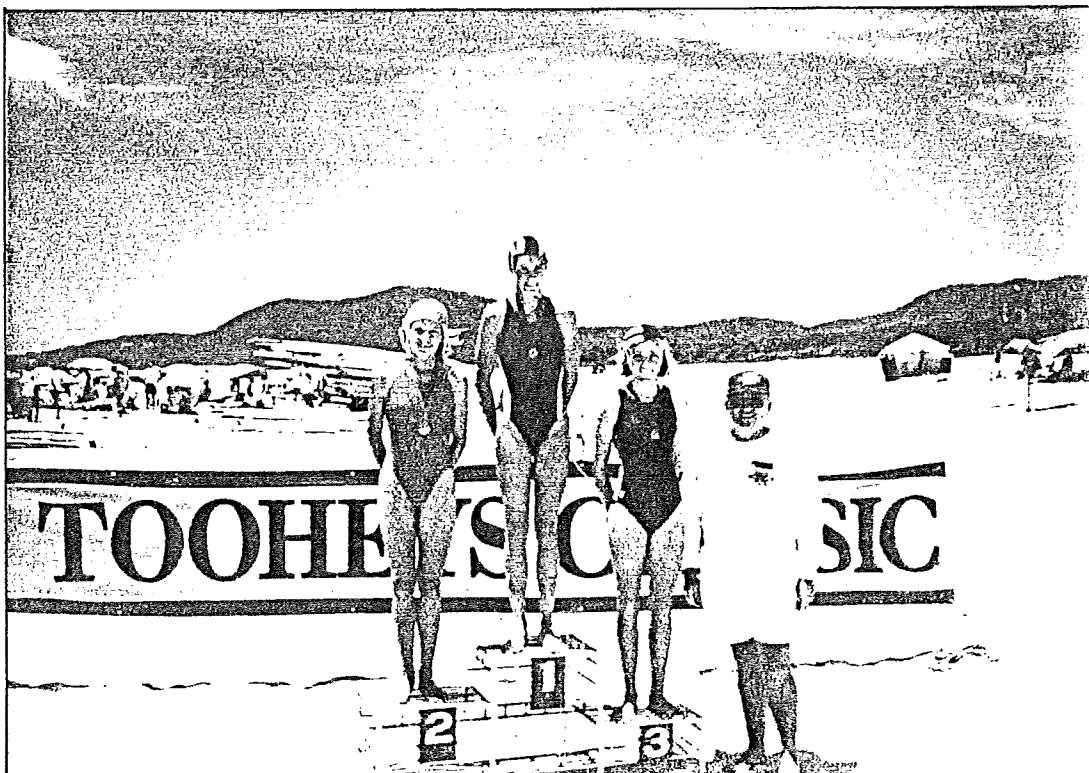
