A long successful season ended on Easter Monday for the thirty active members who fulfil the constitutional charter of a Surf Club by patrolling the beach. Well in excess of 1200 voluntary hours being given by these members.

Saturday afternoon surveillance and all day Sunday four man patrols during October, November followed by December, January's four man patrols on both days and Public Holidays heavily taxed all members.

X Their careful surveillance saw no major water rescues needed during the season. Assistance for minor abrasions, blue bottle stings, a stingray accident and the removal of the occasional wayward reptile being rendered to the public.

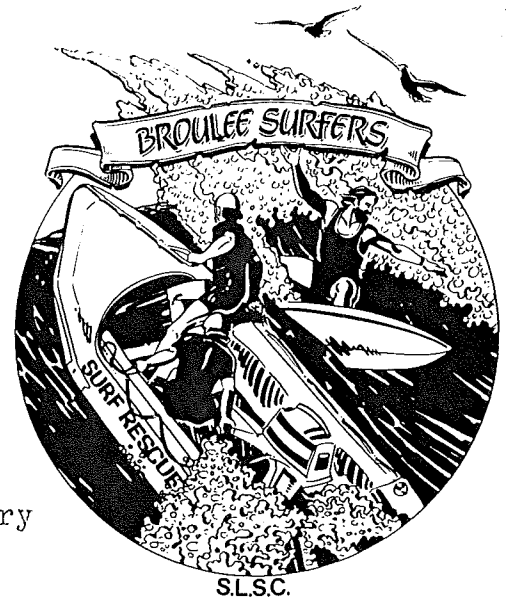

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## PRESIDENT'S REPORT & SECRETARY'S REPORT 1983 - 84 SEASON



This time last year, a strong Executive Committee and complement of Officers were elected to manage the Club for the year that is about to end.

Once again it was a challenging year and many matters brought pressure and work load on the Club's Officers. During the year, resignations were received from the Club's President, the Vice-President, Club Captain/Instructor, the Contest Organiser, the Publicity Officer, the Gear Steward and the Assistant Secretary. Also, the Club's Builder left the District. The remaining Officers held the Club together and the Executive was restructured. After a new Secretary had volunteered to handle the job, I was elected President and also handled Publicity and Greg Fay was elected Vice-President, Terry Freeman elected Club Captain and Don Brown elected Instructor. The positions of Contest Organiser, Gear Steward and Assistant Secretary remained vacant. The Building Committee carried on with the help of voluntary local Builders.

The major highlight of the year was the internal completion of the Clubhouse, so as to make it useable. Many thanks go to all those who helped to achieve this, it certainly made the functioning and the operations of the Club a lot easier and more enjoyable throughout the Season. Thanks to a \$1,500 grant to the Club from the Shire Council and a successful dance at the Palua Bay Bowling Club on the Queen's Birthday Weekend, our Club has the money to order the weatherboards to line the outside of the Clubhouse upstairs. A \$5,000 loan has been arranged with the Commonwealth Bank at Moruya so that the Clubhouse can be completed. The Government Guarantee of this loan has been delayed, but should shortly be finalised. Many thanks to all of the Business Houses that helped with materials and to all of the voluntary workers for their willing services. The Clubhouse is a permanent testimony of your help.

The only "bitter pill" that had to be swallowed during the year was that, on advice from our own Solicitors, the Club withdrew the Court action that it took against the offenders regarding the sinking of the Club's Jet Boat at the Tomago River Public Jetty last year. This occurred just after the Jet Boat had been completely overhauled and just when it had established itself as a vital part of Surf Rescue equipment in the District. The boat itself is intact, it is the motor and the electrics that need replacement. Our Jet Boat could be back in service next season with volunteer help to chase sponsors and donations and to work on the necessary refitting.

X As can be seen from the Officer's Reports, the Club successfully completed its 5th Season, which again was without the loss of any lives on its patrolled beach. The end of the Season was reached on a high note with the Club conducting and also winning the Branch I.R.B. (Rubber Duck) Championships and being awarded the winners of the Branch Patrol Efficiency Competition.

I wish to thank all of the other members of the Executive and the Club's Committees for their valuable efforts, as well as all the voluntary helpers, especially the ladies for their work during the year. Voluntary work such as this is a personal commitment that is not for one's own attainment, but for the benefit of the community. Personal satisfaction can be obtained by knowing that it has been a job well done.

It is the community who should consider the Surf Club as one of the local assets, in that it provides a service to all who use our surfing beach, as well as a facility for all age groups to enjoy and to apply their energies to. The Clubhouse is available for the use of local people for the many varied functions that are part and parcel of community life and is therefore an integral part of the development of the area. Suggestions or advice from anyone in the community and any offers of help would always be most welcome.

As our Club ends another successful year in surf lifesaving, let us commit ourselves to work together and to enjoy the year ahead, so that it may be more rewarding still and, let the operations of our Surf Club continue to be a team effort.
