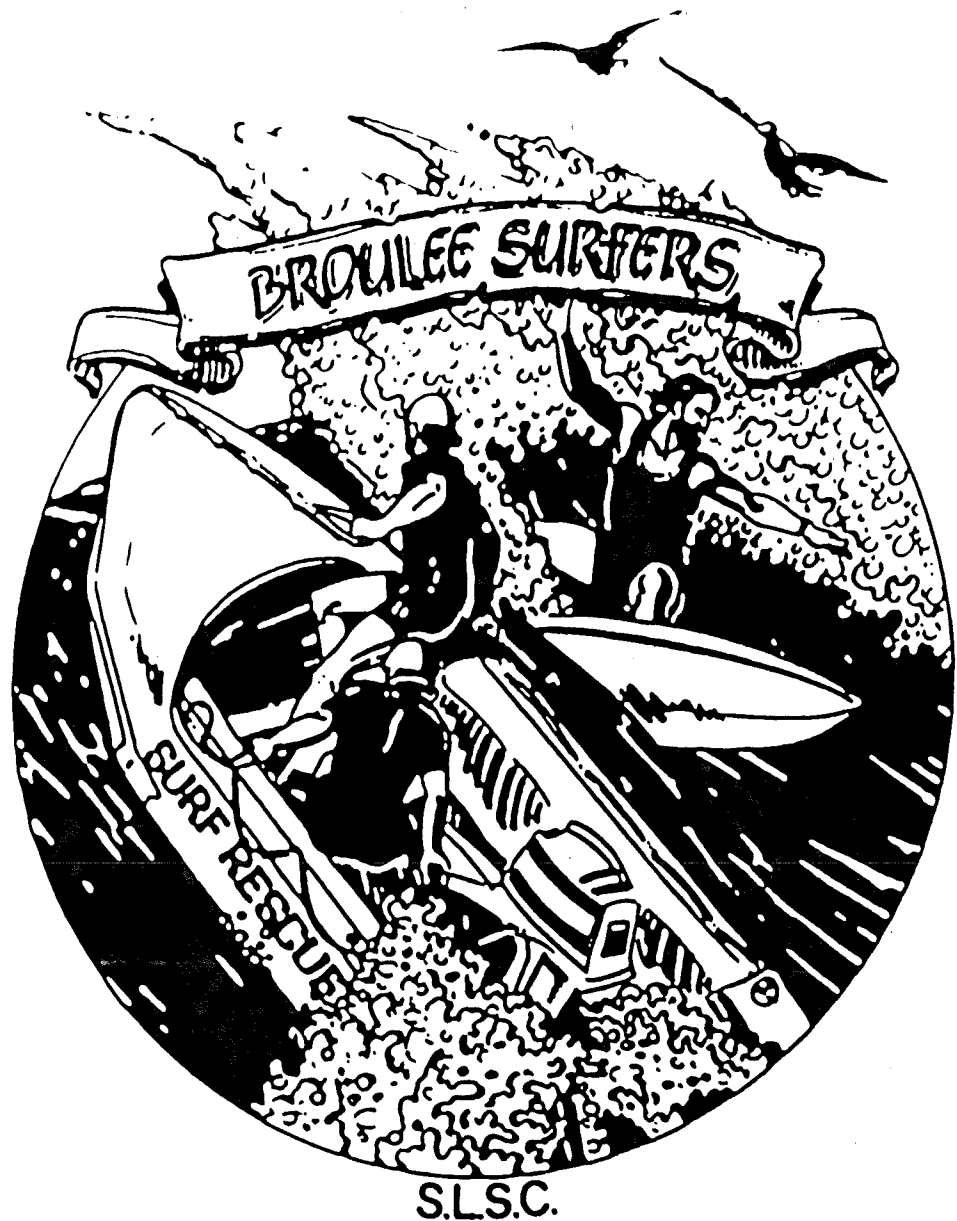

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 1986-87 SEASON

I was elected President for the latter part of the 86/87 season following, the former President, Greg Pay and family leaving the district.

Since the Broulee Club beginning 8 seasons ago, Greg and Judy have played a large part in the establishment and development of the Club. A great deal of time and energy has been expended over these years, both having held many and various Committee positions. It would be true to say that the Club would not be this far down the track without their involvement. To Greg, Judy and family a special thanks and I am sure all the Club wishes them well as they settle into a new area.

I would like to thank all the active members who gave up their own time and their families time to patrol our beaches. Without their voluntary help our local community and our holiday visitors would not be provided with this life saving service. I also wish to thank all of the other members of the Executive and the Club's Committees for their valuable efforts. Voluntary work such as this is a personal commitment that is not for one's own attainment, but for the benefit of the community. Personal satisfaction can be obtained by knowing that it has been a job well done.

The Club has competed in all South Coast Branch Carnivals and travelled to many of the Inter-Branch and State Carnivals. To their credit, enthusiasm continues to grow within our competitors and I feel sure they look forward to next season.

For the first time Club members attended the Australian Championships. Due to the Club's financial situation we were unable to provide any direct financial assistance. The Junior Boat Crew led by Lionel Franks and assisted by Club members embarked on a sponsorship plan and fund raising activities specifically designed to provide the funds for the crew to compete in Western Australia. The Club can be proud of their efforts both in getting to W.A. and in reaching the quarter finals.

As we moved further into the Surf Club competitive area storage facilities were needed. The Club embarked on an ambitious expansion plan with the availability of a building grant from State Centre. The Club commenced the construction of the boat shed by taking out a bank loan. This along with maintenance and restoration of the exterior of the Club house and further painting and tiling of wet areas invariably placed further demands on our finances.

The I.R.B. probably our most essential piece of rescue equipment was in need of maintenance work, so a \$2000 loan was taken out to pay for the work. Final costs stretched beyond our Club's means, therefore, money meant for running costs had to be used to payout the loans, as interest repayments would have further complicated the problem.

Our Club must work to pay for the assets it now has before committing itself to any further spending. Unfortunately the break-in, vandalism and damage on New Year's eve has placed even further hardship on our Club.

It has been most gratifying to receive the support of our local community and we look forward to this continuing in the future. Early in the season the Tomago River Social Club held a bowls day raising much needed funds. We also received an invitation from the Moruya Bowling Club to combine with the Moruya S.L.S.C. in a fund raising day, which was held in April.

As the Club house nears completion members of the community have been able to use the facilities offered to them for private functions, thus we provide an additional service to the local community.

The Club has successfully completed its 8th season, without the loss of any lives on our beach, due to the high standard and skilfulness of our patrolmen. During our last season the I.R.B. team continued to prove their competence by competing and gaining 2nd place in the Branch I.R.B. Championships.

Our Club continues to go forward, let us work together so that in the future the rewards of our hard work may be enjoyed by all.

We went close to winning the patrol efficiency and had a massive 114 rescues on our beach this season without a life being lost. A remarkable achievement and a true indication of the dedication our boys and girls put into their Surf Club.
