### **BUILDING PROGRAMME**

The Club received a grant of \$10,000 from State centre to assist with the building programme in the 1989/90 Season.

This has enabled us to carry out the following work:-

BOAT SHED - All building now complete and ready for final inspection by the Council.

Power, water and telephone now connected.

Building has been treated for termite infestation.

Security locks have been installed.

CLUB HOUSE - Downstairs has been lined with fireproof gyprock.

A 3 metre wide concrete apron has been laid under the entire bakcony area. Arrangements are also on hand for the laying of a concrete walkway on the N.E. corner of the building. (i.e. outside the public conveniences for ladies) Arrangements are also in hand for the laying of a concrete apron outside the main entrance to the Clubhouse.

Plumbing, tiling and painting of toilets now completed.

Vinyl floorcovering and painting of the kitchenette has been completed and a security shutter is on order.

The balcony has been enclosed with an attractive, sturdy treated-pine handrailing.

The exterior staircase has been installed and treated against the weather and security gates and mesh are on order.

Security locks have been installed.
