



# Sixteenth Annual Report & Balance Sheet For Season 1994-95

Ladies and Gentlemen,

his 16th Annual Report and Balance Sheet is submitted to you for your consideration and adoption at the forthcoming Sixteenth Annual General Meeting of the Club. It covers the activities of the Club and its Members for the 1994/95 Season.

The prime object of the Club, that is the safeguard of the surfing public, has again been carried out faithfully and efficiently. Through constant 'Vigilance and Service', once again it is with pride that we record that no lives were lost on Broulee Beach. This has not been achieved with the full co-operation of all Members however with several of our Active Members content to allow the burden of patrols to be shouldered by their Clubmates. The Committee will be closely examining the Patrol records this coming Season and Members will be asked to account for their failure to attend rostered Patrols. Many thanks to all those who accepted their responsibilities willingly and honoured their obligations, completing their Patrols and at the same time enjoying what Broulee Beach has to offer.

The Club has had a busy year and under the capable leadership of President Terry Freeman, much has been achieved:

#### **FINANCE**

Hon. Treasurer Vince Lollback has kept close control of Club finances which are in a healthy position. The Committee saw fit to negotiate an overdraft with the Commonwealth Bank, Moruya near the end of the Season to complete new facilities in the Clubhouse. This overdraft will be honoured in the early part of our 1995/96 operations.

#### **NEW FACILITIES**

A new bar and provision for a new kitchen and a Secretary's Office were major accomplishments by your Club. A tremendous amount of work has been done by several Members. The concept of these facilities has

been discussed for many years and it was John Zanotti who drew up suggested plans and commenced the task of refurbishing the Club. Our Radio Officer, Col Gallagher, was to the fore with the relocation of our speaker systems and our television reception points. Justin McCarthy generously gave of his time and considerable expertise in fitting out the facility which we believe is second to none. It is difficult to properly assess the efforts of John Zanotti and Justin McCarthy in the completion of this project.

Along the way, considerable assistance has been given by Todd Hayward, Steve Rawlings, Brian King and Ross Manskie together with many other Club Members.

The Club has secured a Function On-Licence to allow us the operate these facilities and in this regard we acknowledge the efforts of our Honorary Legal Officer, John Edmunds (Kennedy & Cooke, Moruya) for his invaluable assistance. As we plan for the future we have been gratefully assisted by Rod Shanahan who is well acquainted with financial management.

The Club extends its gratitude to the above persons for their most welcome efforts and their support. The ultimate aim of this exercise is the make the Club financially independent. Broulee does not have a population power base held by other Clubs along the coast and the raising of finance is not easy. We have not been able to supply the facilities and equipment needed to operate the Club at its potential and we are confident that these facilities will give us the resources to do just that.

The facilities were opened by Russell Smith MP (Member for Bega) at a very successful function on 16th April, 1995. Also at this function was Russell's wife, Lesley, representatives of the Mollymook and Moruya SLSC's, several Guests who had made a contribution or gave assistance to the project and many Club Members.

It is pleasing to report that the people of Broulee have embraced the new facilities enthusiastically and are increasingly using the Club House and its facilities, (the only such facilities available in Broulee) for a variety of private parties and celebrations.

Involved with the development of the refurbished facilities from the beginning and charged with the success of their operation has been our House Captain, John Hall. John has worked tirelessly to ensure that the new facilities will benefit the Club in every way. The Club deeply appreciates the efforts of John and the support given him by his wife, Kerry.

#### **SLSA AWARDS**

The Club has had its most successful year ever with a number and variety of SLSA Awards gained by its Members. A total of 62 Awards were gained by the Club Members during the Season and a complete list of those successful awardees appears in this Report. We trust that the Club continues this achievement during the coming Season.

#### COMPETITION

It must be reported that the Club had a mixed year in Branch competition. When the Club attended a Carnival in force we could win the point score. However this was rarely the case and at some Carnivals we had only 2-3 competitors which reflects poorly upon our Club and those charged with the responsibility of organising our active members and particularly our younger active Members. It is a poor reflection upon this Club when we have abysmal representation at the Carnivals conducted by other Clubs in the Branch when we expect their support at our own Carnival. This situation must be assessed this coming Season.

They gave of their best and were narrowly shaded by the Bay who pushed our Crew into second place on six legs - one leg with a one second margin after a row of over 20 kms! Congratulations to the crew and to all their support crew.

George has announced that he and Val are sponsoring a new boat and will donate the 'Sursolac 2' to the Club. The Club is most appreciative of George and Val's generosity. After discussion with George it has been resolved by the Committee that 'Sursolac 2' will be stationed in Canberra for at least the leadup to the 1997 George Bass Marathon where it will be available for training.

#### IRB Captain's Report

nother busy season for the IRB'S, with normal Patrol usage also with the Nippers on Sunday mornings.

Good to note that no lives were lost on the beach.

During Patrol use and training make sure all pre-checks are carried out and fill out the log books and signed by the Patrol Captain. Have the leg of the outboard in deep enough water so sand and grit doesn't get sucked up in the impeller around the cooling system (thermostat) in the power head - same goes for returning to shore.

Keep your distance (18m - 50ft from flagged area unless in a rescue situation. NB five hours should be logged in 1.5 to 2.0m surf, a minimum of fifteen hours all up.

On the maintenance side, the Zodiac had a service up the coast.

Johnson No1, gearbox oil changed, impeller checked for wear, the carburettor stripped and cleaned, cavitator plate crack welded and a doubler plate welded to it for extra strength. The stainless steel prop guard was welded, the fuel filter cleaned and new spark plugs fitted.

Johnson No 2 completed 10 hours of running in use ready for the first service at the dealer.

Tohatsu, new spark plugs fitted, thermostat inspected, starter rope housing replaced, safety gear linkage bracket replaced, carburettor stripped and cleaned, fuel pump stripped and cleaned, impeller replaced, gearcase oil changes, top and bottom gearcase seals replaced, stainless steel propeller guard cracks repaired and propeller centre re-bushed.

Purchased two new 20 litre fuel tanks. Cleaner fuel, NB any motor uses leaded petrol only unless the exhaust is fitted with a catalytic convertor.


Two fire extinguishers were mounted on the walls.

I would like to thank Nick for phone calls, organising parts etc, John Zanotti for mounting the fire extinguishers, the Colonel and Hendo for help lifting the motors, not to mention the grease & oil they mopped up with their clothes.

Also my thanks to my partner and staff (Batemans Bay Engineering) for helping me with some repairs and for the use of equipment.


George Bass Marathon 1995- Broulee: Photo Courtesy of 'Southern Star'


he good news from the First Aid Room is that it has been a fairly quiet season. The bad news is that the Surf Club recommends vaccination against Hepatitis B for all active members.

All reported treatments of first aid during this season were of a minor nature except the odd hangover that I believe required more extensive resuscitation! There were a small number of treatments for minor cuts and abrasions and 44 reported treatments for Marine Stings. Thankyou to Quirky for the continuous supply of Stingose - how big was the truck......?!



Recommended first aid treatment for Bluebottle and other jellyfish stings on the South Coast:

• Remember to wash off remaining tentacles with water and apply ice for at least 15min as vinegar may cause further stinging. Vinegar (& resus) is the treatment for the dangerous Box Jellyfish or Sea Wasp in tropical waters. Warm to very warm water (not burning) for Stingrays. Pressure and immobilise (& resus) treatment for Blue Ringed Octopus.



Special First Aid Room Bravery Awards go to the 29 members who received initial or booster Hep B vaccinations! The Club recommends vaccination for active members or anyone who may be exposed to the Hepatitis B virus. The virus is spread by contact with infected blood or body fluids. Immunity gained from Hepatitis B vaccination is not necessarily permanent or lifelong, boosters may be required.

If you are an active member you should know your current Hepatitis B immune status determined by a blood test. Whatever your immune status and whatever the virus the best protective measure is to always to treat any human blood and body fluids as infectious.

Thank you to all Club members, committee members and supporters for your work and assistance this season.



he years in which I have held the position of Hon. Treasurer have all had one thing in common — change.



With the support of our sponsors and fund raising activities we have been able to operate successfully.


