Presidents Report

Another very busy season for Broulee. An influx of new and transferred members means that we now have 328 Members. This includes 183 Active (inc. SRC Award, Reserve) and 118 Junior Members, not to mention our Associate 35, and Life Members (7) who are very active within our club.

The start of our season saw our Boat Shed get a much needed face lift, being re clad by Gary Robbins with help from Graeme Williams and Ron Richards and support from Steeline Batemans Bay. We were hoping to put extensions on but, after almost two years, Local Council has still not approved our DA Proposal (very frustrating for all involved). In fact we have withdrawn our DA. The new extension would provide a training area, separate change areas for female and male members and allow us to use our current shed for appropriate storage of our expensive and invaluable Life Saving equipment to ensure its longevity. Local member Andrew Constance has written a letter to Broulee SSLSC offering his support for this venture. So ... NEXT SEASON?

A big thank you to the Catalina Country Club who lent us a diesel 2 seater Golf Cart with tray to use on Patrols over the busy Christmas/New Year period. This meant that we had 2 vehicles that we could use to transport equipment to

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and from the beach. Being a 2 seater we were also able to use it to safely send roving patrols further south along the beach.

2006/07 also saw the introduction of the new Australian Resuscitation Council Guidelines for resuscitation which saw us adopt new rates for CPR for all patrolling members. This is one of the biggest changes to happen in SLS in recent history. Thanks to our Trainers and Assessors, and of course our members, for giving up their valuable time to ensure that this transition was as smooth as possible. It should be noted that the changes were well accepted by all involved.

Having six active Trainers and Assessors within our club also allowed the work load to be shared around a bit this season. With Surf Rescue Certificate, Bronze Medallion, Advanced Resuscitation, Radio Operators, Defibrillation and Patrol Captain courses being run over the season.

After a quiet season for our boats last year (due to injury) our boats have been very active this season. Under Boat Captain Gary Pettigrove and local sweeps Rob Pollock and Rhys Harris our crews have been very competitive. Just as importantly they have also been very active within the club, meeting their Patrol requirements, helping at the Bar and Bistro, they were also the driving force behind the Moruya to Broulee Fun Run that was held at the beginning of the season.

Yet again our Youth continues to go from strength to strength. The roles that these youth, the Age Managers, Water Safety and, of course, the parents/carers play within our club is integral to the success and viability of Broulee Surfers as a Surf Life Saving Club. Thank you to David (and Wendy) Law for your efforts again this season.

We have been very fortunate to have a Social Committee this season. Through various functions and evenings that they have organized, not only have they raised awareness (and some \$\$\$) they have also made sure that we all remember that being a part of Broulee Surfers SLSC is FUN and that we shouldn't take ourselves too seriously. Still on the social side of things, our 25th Anniversary is fast approaching. The Open Womens crew (BPs) after a strong season where the women the Branch championship, went to the Australian Championships in Perth and unfortunately did get passed the third round in the tricky shore break.

The Under 23's and M&Ms both had a solid season but work/family commitments and the lack of a consistent sweep interfered with their training and competition schedule.

The Canberra based crews took a while to get their new members qualified for the Bronze and struggled in their first few carnivals but developed well as the season went on with the women making the final of the South Coast Boat Series final event at Warillia. Radio Report

This season was a productive one in terms of radio operation. All radios were reprogrammed early in the season and the only malfunctions were caused by outside agencies. The base station is now working correctly and should be used for logon and logoff to Surfcom Narooma and to monitor all other clubs in case of emergencies.

Protective radio bags have a high turnover rate, if you can't work out how to open and close them correctly, ask some one. If the locking toggles are broken we have to buy complete bags. If you notice a bag with holes in it, please do not use that bag in the water.

In the event a radio is dropped in the surf please notify your patrol captain, then remove the battery and rinse with water.

I would like to see every patrolling member complete the Radio Operators certificate so that all can be more confident in their use any time. I'd like to remind all members that it is mandatory for every patrol to have a member in the radio room at all times whilst a patrol is on the beach, to monitor the radios, call in emergencies and assist other clubs if a major rescue is required to help contact more members. NO EXCEPTIONS. Thank you to the patrols, which currently are practicing this.

Secretary's Report

Most of our members have now been upgraded to Certificate II s . A number of us will be upgrading our skills on the 28th of July at Tathra in using surf guard.

The changes to the delivery of CPR protocols have been well received and implemented this season. The club now has 3 Oxy vivas and one defibrillator. We are looking at placing the defibrillator into the main hall of the club where it can be more easily accessed in case of an emergency. The questions we must all ask are we ready to use this equipment in an emergency if called upon. I would like to see every member of the club complete their CPR and, Defibrillator and spinal management courses this year. That includes associate members.

All proficient members should report for the patrols for which they are rostered. As our patrols have grown so to have the number of phantoms. For non competition members this is solely a problem for you and your fellow patrol members who you let down.

For competitive members it can result in the disqualification of the team and or the individual. It is important that you contact the secretary before the start of the season if you do not intend to be active for a season. For once your name is entered into surfguard as a patrolling member for that season than we cannot remove it. This mean that if you come back later you will be faced with a number of deficit hours to make up for all the missed hours for the past season.

If you wish to compete you must complete the patrols for which you are rostered, all of them. Surf guard does not recognise it if you turn up and complete it in a mates patrol.

If you wish to compete make sure you know which patrol you are in and when they are rostered Your name may have been accidentally left off the published roster. No excuse.

Hopefully a full copy of patrol regulations will be available to all members before the start of next season.

May I thank all club members who have made this last season such an enjoyable one.

I would also like to thank all the local members and members of the community who support our Friday nights throughout the year and our other club functions, all of which raise funds for the club.
