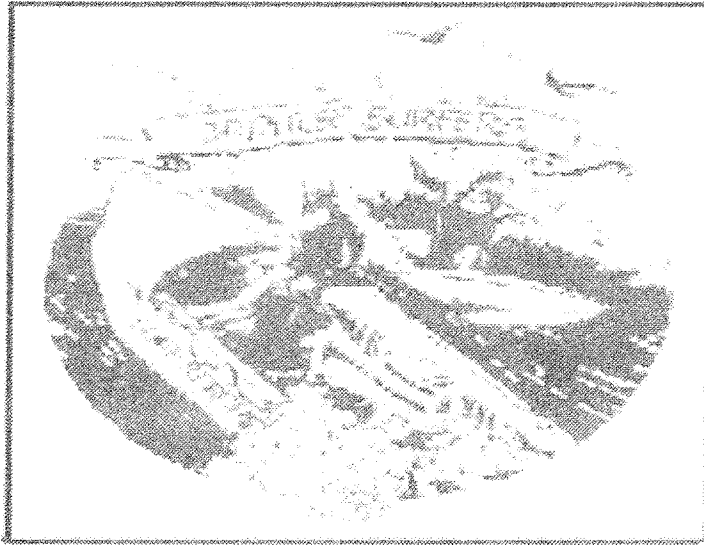

The Broulee crews completed successfully in a range of events including the South Coast Boat Series, NSW Open Carnivals, Far South Coast Branch Carnivals, NSW States Titles and the George Bass Surf Boat Marathon during season 2007/08. This report highlights the successes, the rowers and thanks the support crews and sponsors. The newly formed Veterans crew had outstanding success all season and the under 19 and under 23 crews continued the successes that Broulee has been enjoying. The rowers would like to thank the club for its support for the crews and equipment for this season.

The Crews and Successes

Open Men's crew consisted of Rebecca Wright, Darren Phillips, Tom Hilyear, Rhys Harris, Peter Halkett, Richard Hogg and Trygve Casben. They won the Branch Championships. The other Open rowers were Michael Johnston and John Ivanoff who rowed at the South Coast Boat Series. Michael's parents became ill and he went QLD to help them at Christmas time and the crew did not complete the series of events.

Open Women's had two crews competing this season.

The Broulee local Women's crews consisted of Rebecca Morris, Rebecca Wright, Kirsty Luff, Natalie Cahill, Nikki Kemp, Michelle Cottington, Michelle Zutt, Taryn Brauman, Mel Fitzgerald and Jacquie Wilson and Rob Pollock as sweep.

The Broulee Canberra based Open women's crew consisted of Sonia Domitrak, Pip Butt, Kate Waterhouse, Bo Raphael, Emily Flowers, Amelia Lee, Tracey Vassallo and Gary Pettigrove as sweep,

In the South Coast Boat Series they were given equal first in the final event at Warilla where solid 3 metre waves made racing interesting.

Reserve Men's crew consisted of Gary Pettigrove, Pat Salter, Russell Ott, Jeff Dunne, Jeff Brewer, Shane Belchambers, Phil Cook, Andrew Flemming and Toby George. The crew struggled to perform consistently at the carnivals but had some very competitive races.

Under 23 male crew consisted of Rhys Harris, Nathan Hazel, Zac Ekin, and Tim Weyman who rowed in the George Bass Marathon and Tom Hilyear rowed sprints with them.

In the South Coast Boat Series they came third overall. In the carnivals they came:

First at Warilla,

Second at Port Kembla,

They also rowed in the NSW Open race at Manly and finalists fifth.

Under 19 male Crew was Mitch Connaughton, Jake Bowles, Tom Lollback, Tom Hilyear and Ryan Pollock who filled in at a few carnivals. Their results were excellent for this season, they came: First in the George Bass Marathon (175 km) junior division and broke four of existing leg records and set two new records.

This year the Broulee Surfers SLSC had two crews in the 175km George Bass Marathon race.

They came fifth overall rowed all of the 7 race legs. They were the first Eurobodalla Women's crew to do this as in the past the females only did 4 of the 7 legs.

Nippers Report.

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the 2008 annual report for our junior members.

2008 has been an enjoyable and successful year for the nippers and junior members.

It would of course not be possible without the tireless efforts of our newly formed junior sub-committee, age managers, and all the help we have had from our senior members and parents. The Sub-Committee has worked hard to make the season an enjoyable and educational experience for all. A big thank you to everyone that has helped.

This year we have been able to introduce things like the nipper's booklet, newsletters, nipper's notice board, and regular training days.

Sundays have been well attended and I am sure all would agree that the age managers have done a fantastic job in coming up with inventive and creative ways to educate our children, keeping the kids entertained and enthusiastic.

One of the highlights of this season has been the introduction of the water safety uniforms and the co-ordination of the water safety by Gordon Hughes. We have been very fortunate to have someone with Gordon's expertise to help us in this area. Nothing can be more important than the safety of our kids and without Gordon and his band of merry helpers we would not have been able to run the nippers in the safe and organised format that you have witnessed this year. Well done and many thanks to Gordon and all who helped with water safety.

This year saw the successful introduction of nippers training for those children that wanted to improve their surf sport skills. These sessions were well attended and a noticeable improvement was evident in all participants.

An example of the kid's new found confidence was evident on one very miserable afternoon, the surf was an absolute mess and a good size, the southerly was howling in and it was pouring down. Much to the parents surprise we suited up and headed out into it, not one child complained and they all handled the very difficult conditions. These were conditions that most long term life savers would have found challenging. A great effort from all of our training team.

On the competition front we have had great results locally and mixed results at our representative carnivals. We have had good attendance at all our local carnivals and continue to dominate. We again won the overall point score, and along the way recorded a lot of high placings. More important than the point score we have shown fantastic sportsmanship and a willingness to have a go.

A good example of having a go was the participation of the parents at the combined carnivals, well done to all the parents that led by example in particular, Shannon Dougherty, Darren Browning, Sandra Boneham, Wendy Law & Gabby Phillips; we look forward to seeing you at the state and Aussie carnivals next year.

In the junior area it has been good to see Ben & Eva attending a few of the senior carnivals, where they always do well. It would be great to see them, and a few more of their friends getting involved at the representative carnivals.

On the representative front we attended 2 carnivals, the Country Championships and the State Championships. Our Country team consisted of Emma & Jack Harman, Annie & Jack Phillips, Daniel, Robbie & Nicholas Hogg, Jacob, Ashley & Josh Carasco. Conditions at the championships were very difficult, with a large swell and strong rips, at one stage we were even moved to another location. The team performed well against the stronger country clubs and we were competitive in every event we participated in. We managed to secure a few medals, a fantastic achievement for a small club well done to Jack Harman 2nd in the flags & 4th in the sprint & Annie Phillips 1st in the Board 3rd in the swim.

A Highlight from this carnival for me was the kid's fantastic support of each other. No matter where they finished, or what happened they were always supportive and encouraging of each other, and the other competitors. **THE TRUE SIGN OF REAL SPORTS PEOPLE.**

Other highlights were; Nicholas Hogg realising that he could get past people in the wade without offending anyone. Robbie Hogg's great effort in his swim and board (see hard training, pays off Robbie). Jacob Carrasco's never say die attitude. (Even if he has been washed to the other end of the beach and is about to drown, he still wants to finish). Diego and I getting washed down the beach when doing water safety, and having to swim back to where we started. (I don't know how the kids do it). Sharing our tent with other competitors from the Far South Coast.

After the Country Championships it was time to get ready for the State Championships. The Team consisted of Alex & Sam Law, Annie & Jack Phillips, Nicholas, Robbie & Daniel Hogg, Emma & Jack Harman, Billy Hughes-Tweedie and Pip Marques.

This carnival is always very challenging for our kids as they are competing against all the larger clubs in the State. Clubs that live, and breathe, for first place. They train their kids up to 5 days a week. They select only the best from their clubs to compete & they have a lot of funds and support.

Our team as always competed to the best of their ability and did us proud. They showed great dignity, in their races and got a good perspective on what they have to work on if they want to compete at the highest level. We had some outstanding results with;

Pip Marques finishing 4th in the final of the Surf Board Riding

Annie Phillips did very well she was against 200 odd competitors in her board and swim events and finished with two seventh placings in the finals.

Pip also represented our branch in the Junior Lifesaver of the Year Contest. Although Pip didn't win the event she was highly praised by the judges for her enthusiasm, commitment and knowledge of Surf Life Saving. Well done Pip.

On one occasion with Steve Ziegler they successfully prevented a fishing boat with three people on board from being pounded ashore in the vicinity Bengello creek. People involved were most grateful and have made a donation to the club and Thank you cards to Steve and Gary. With the demise of the volunteer rescue association in Moruya these incidents may occur more often. Where are does our duty of care start and finish.

All patrolling members should be aware that there is key to the gate at Shark Bay on the key ring for the quad bike to be used in emergencies. Besides the enormous support that we need for the ASRL carnival in February, those that wish to compete should endeavour to ensure that they have satisfied their patrolling requirements for competitors. Remember deficit hours for this season carry over to next season.

A big thank you to all who have helped to make this last season's such an enormous success. This includes those who assisted with the bistro, the bar, barbecue, preparing and cleaning up beaches for carnivals, cleaning the clubhouse and supporting each other during this year.
