President's Report 2012-2013

2012-2013 has been another successful year for our club. This success is only possible through the efforts of members and our supporters and all of the different areas of the club working together to achieve common goals.

The core function of the club is surf lifesaving. There have been patrols on Broulee Beach since September with most patrolling members completing up to 45 hours of rostered patrols. Some members have completed well above this level and many others have achieved the distinction of completing 100% of their patrol hours. The patrols have operated in an efficient and professional manner and this is a credit not only to all patrollers but also the Patrol Captains. There have been 56 rescues, 98 first aids and 302 preventions recorded this season. Over 19,000 visitors to our beach were recorded and no fatalities were recorded. The role of Club Captain is critical in this success. I thank Anthony Griffiths who has organised patrol rosters, entered relevant information onto Surfguard and generally sorted any problems that have arisen throughout the season.

The club has continued to be part of Surf Life Saving NSW emergency response system. The team has responded to 35 after hour callouts ranging from a kite surfer with a broken leg on North Broulee Beach to a car driving into the Moruya River. We congratulate this team as they show much dedication and professional skill in carrying out their role.

The club has had a break through with council in gaining an emergency access track from Bayside St through to North Broulee Beach. This will reduce response time in the event of a callout to this area and this is something the club has been lobbying for a number of years. Geoff Wells has been the main driver of this campaign and deserves our thanks for his efforts.

Nippers have again had a big year. Their numbers have been maintained at 145 and have again won the FSC Dave Pheeney Junior Point Score Trophy. Congratulations to all the nippers and to age managers, trainers and coordinators. It is reassuring to see such enthusiastic and energetic nippers sessions on our beach of a Sunday morning. Nippers are our future lifesavers and the future of our club. Based on this, our club should continue to succeed for years to come. Thanks must also go to parents and those who provide water safety on a regular basis. A special mention must be made to James Langley who has completed 10 years of providing water safety to our nippers.

Broulee competitors have again achieved well in local carnivals and at State and Aussies level. The club has again retained the Jack Beale Trophy and is the FSC Branch champion club. Several of our competitors will undoubtedly pick up branch awards for their efforts this year. The boat crews have been highly successful with the u19 boys being the standout crew. They have won the Best of the Best and have achieved good results in the other events they have entered. This level of success comes through many long hours of training and through the coaching from their sweep Rob Pollock.

We can't have patrols or competitors without trainers and assessors. They put in many hours training new squads, IRB crews and also assess active members with annual proficiencies. Special thanks goes to all the team but especially to Mike Lambert, Peter Halpin, Gary Robbins and coordinator Shane Madden.

The second Hotondo Homes Bay to Breakers Ocean Swim was held in March this year. The event was again a success with over 180 swimmers competing. In the near perfect conditions many course records were broken. Many competitors gave positive feedback on the event and I am sure the swim is now well established as an annual event. This success is largely due to the organising committee led by Gary Pettigrove, the assistance given by our joint partners the Broulee & Mossy Point Community association and businesses who sponsored the event. A big thank you goes to Darren Phillips from Hotondo Homes for his generous support being our major sponsor.

Another area of success is the Sunday morning swim, both the competitive swims in summer and the sometimes freezing swims in winter. They have been well supported and they have played a role in bringing members closer together. Barb and Geoff Wells have put a great deal of effort into running these swims and deserve our thanks for doing so. While the club has not had to deal with major upkeep issues such as last year's refurbishment of the club's deck, we have been active in planning for our future. David Butt has put together grant applications for money to commence extensions to the gear shed and has also written a business plan to help the club set and achieve future goals. Let us hope we are successful in gaining enough funds to begin these long overdue extensions. David has also been involved in ongoing discussions with council in an attempt to gain a lease over the club facilities.

To run a successful Surf Lifesaving Club takes a lot of money. While much of this comes from SLS NSW and various levels of government, we must also raise funds to be viable. Much of this money is raised through the bar and the summer bistro. This is not possible without the efforts of those who volunteer to run these activities. This year the bistro was run By Sue Lindsay and Tess Snowball and this was Sue's third year in a row. A big thank you goes to both ladies and to their band of helpers. A big thank you also goes to John Edmunds who has managed to convert out liquor licence to a full on premise licence. I would also like to acknowledge those who assisted with the door knock at Easter. We raised \$2600 in a little over two hours — a good return for our effort.

A club doesn't run itself and this is where the committee plays a vital role. All members have contributed their time, wisdom and knowledge in making good decisions not only in the day to day running of the club but also in setting the course for the future. Special thanks goes to the Executive of Wendy Law (Secretary), Lynda McKay (Treasurer), Geoff Wells (Vice-President), Anthony Griffiths (Club Captain) and Mike Lambert (Training Officer). We have a good club. It is professional and functions efficiently. We are fortunate that all areas within the club work together as a team to achieve our common goals. Not only do we deliver quality service to the community but we do it in a way that is social and fun. Club members support each other and this is the main reason the club continues to grow and

build on its strengths. I thank you all for your support this year and look forward to the club having another successful year in 2013-2014.


