PRESIDENT'S REPORT BROULEE SSLSC 2013-2014

2013-2014 has been another very good year for Broulee SSLSC. The strength of our club comes from the dedication, hard work and cooperation from all our members. We have all worked together to achieve our goals of providing surf lifesaving on our beach, emergency callouts, competing in surf carnivals and in building a strong united social group. This year we had a total membership of 427 which included 172 Nippers and 177 patrolling members.

Our prime focus is surf lifesaving. To this end we have patrolled our beach since early September to the end of April. Most members have completed approximately 40 hours of patrols each and 55 of our members completed 100% of their patrol obligations. Our club members carried out 29 rescues, 228 preventions and assisted 26 people with first aid. The callout crew were kept busy responding to 22 incidents.

The role of Club Captain is critical in the functioning of the club. I would like to acknowledge the great job Kirsty Campbell has done in organising patrols, entering statistics onto Surfguard and sorting all the issues that arose over the patrolling season. I must also acknowledge David & Wendy Law who assisted Kirsty in her first year in the job.

Nippers have had another big and successful year. They have retained the Dave Pheeney Junior Point Score Trophy and in doing so are the FSC Branch champions. Congratulations must go not only to the nippers but also to the Age Managers, Coaches, Water safety personnel and parents in supporting our future lifesavers. It is pleasing and reassuring to see the nippers in action each Sunday morning on our beach. The skills they exhibit in all age groups are truly impressive. Special thanks to Scott Elliott and Dave Hosking who have coordinated Nippers for this season. Gary Griffiths must also be thanked for ably coordinating water safety each week.

Broulee competitors have achieved excellent results in local carnivals, at State and at National levels. Broulee has again won the Jack Beale Trophy and is again the FSC champion club. This is the fifth year in a row we have done this. Many of our competitors will pick up branch awards for their efforts. Standout results were from the under 19s Dim Sims boat crew and their sweep Rob Pollock. They were NSW champions in their category. Pete (Fuzz) McKay won gold at state, Darren Browning made the finals at Aussies, as did Darren Phillips. The BATS and the Canberra Capitals womens crew both performed with distinction in the George Bass Marathon.

Our team of trainers and assessors must also be mentioned as they have contributed many hours in training and assessing new SRC, Bronze groups and IRB driver and crew awards. They also do the huge job of assessing all active members in their annual proficiencies. Our thanks specifically go to Mike Lambert, Peter Halpin, Gary Robbins, Gabi Smith, Kel Pearce, Gary Pettigrove, Diego Carrasco and Melinda Brogan. Without them we can't have patrols or competitors.

The Hotondo Homes Bay to Breakers Ocean Swim was another successful event for the club and our partners; The Broulee and Mossy Point Community Association. There were 271 swimmers this year, who swam in near perfect conditions with several race records again being broken. This represented an increase in swimmers competing of 100 over last year's event. Thanks to the organising committee and especially Gary Pettigrove who did a mountain of work as the committee chairperson. Thanks to Darren Phillips from Hotondo Homes for again sponsoring the event.

Running a Surf Club takes a lot of money. While some funds come from SLSNSW and the local council, most of our funds come from the local community and our own members. The summer bistros and bar on Friday nights contribute to this. Our thanks goes to the bar staff, to Cindy for coordinating the Bistro and also to the volunteers who helped with the bistro. I would also like to acknowledge all those who helped with our door knock appeal in January. This raised over \$4000 in a few hours. In addition, I would like to publicly thank our major sponsor The Tomakin Sports and Social Club who have again supported us to the sum of \$5000. We also gained a grant of \$3000 from Clubs NSW arranged by Graham Wise from the Tomakin Club. IGA Supermarket Tomakin also assisted us with a donation of \$2500. CLUB CAPTAINS REPORT 2013/2014

Firstly I would like to thank everyone for their support this season. It has been a huge learning experience for me.

It has been a very busy season with 4425.25 recorded rostered patrol hours, and an amazing 55 100% Patrollers.

There have been no major rescues on our beach this season, and 241 preventions, 3 searches for lost persons and the shark alarm has been sounded once.

A huge Thank you needs to go out to our RWC drivers. We had 6 operators from Broulee who fulfilled the FSC required hours.




A Golden Summer for Surf Boats

The following is a focus report on each crew

BROULEE U23 Women "Sum Ting Wong"

Broulee has its first female Australian Surf Boat Champion when Alisha Meek who rowed all season with Broulee under 23 crew was seconded and did a last minute competitive transfer to Austinmer Under 23 girls and this combined crew took out the Australian Under 23 Women's surfboat championship.

Her crew mates in the "Sum Ting Wong" crew trained hard all season and it proved great preparation for Alicia to her get ready and fill in seamlessly for the Austinmer Club. Austinmer lost a rower a couple of weeks before the Aussies. She was making her Sydney Swifts Netball debut and did her knee three minutes into the game. Alisha did not row with the Austinmer crew until the Championships in Perth and they went on to win every race and take out the Australian Title.

This Under 23 women's crew, the "Sum Ting Wong" had a great start to the year and highlighted by a 2nd place at North Cronulla Carnival, a major Sydney carnival.

At the Young Guns in Robe South Australia they also finished 2nd. They won the point score at Port Kembla South Coast in big surf and finishing second in the overall in the under 23 women's section of South Coast Boat Series. The crew had a great first season and if they are still around next year they will be a stronger crew next year.

BROULEE Under 19 Crew "Dim Sims"

The Under 19 "Dim Sims" won their first NSW Title, reigning supreme in the billiard table flat surf at Umina.

This crew had a remarkable year making every final except for the Australian Championships in Perth where some unfortunate luck came their way.

The "Dim Sims" was the standouts at most carnivals this season. They were selected as the NSW crew in the ASRL Interstate series in Newcastle and did themselves, Broulee and their State proud when the won their under 19 division race in a dramatic race pipping WA for the win. The "Dim Sims" also did their part in helping NSW winning the surfboat relay and clinching the Australian Interstate Title ahead of WA and QLD.

They were the International Young Guns Champions at competitions at Collaroy and Robe South Australia.

They were undefeated in the four South Coast Boat Series carnivals and are South Coast Champions. They were winners at the Sydney Major Carnival at North Cronulla. They also won the FSC Branch Open Male Surf Boat Championship.

The Crew members were Jack Dunn, Ewen Pollock, Hayden Connor, Jeff Gamble and Sweep/Coach Rob Pollock. Robbie Hogg also rowed early in the year and helped until Hayden Connor was able to recover from a knee operation.

Special mention to Craig Shepheard and Matt Stevens who helped put some fitness work into both the Under 19 and under 23 crews.

BROULEE Open Women "Capitals"

A squad of 14 delightful, and dedicated open ladies who put their hearts and minds into surfboat rowing in Canberra and provided a depth of rowers that allowed the swapping of rowers at any stage and they still perform at the highest level.

The Capitals focused mostly on the Surfboat Marathons this season and performed successfully.

The season's results included:

- The two Capital's crews finished 1st (Gold) and 6th in the 14km Rooster River Marathon in September
- The two crews combined to win Silver in the 180km George Bass marathon Silver Medals
- The NSW Country Championships saw Silver medals in the Open Women's section final after they won every lead up race
- Gold Polar Bears won the Far South Coast Open Branch Open Women's Surfboat Champions for the third year in a row

The Capital's Bass Journey

Our Bass journey started with 13 ladies in the cold Canberra Winter mornings in July 2013. The ladies showed commitment and resilience by turning up around 5:30am up to 5 mornings per week in temperatures well below zero.

Six of the ladies had done a Bass before but seven new members and novice rowers were recruited to make a squad that the best 10 could be selected from and ensure we were competitive. Our goal was to be at least one km/hr faster for this Bass compared to the 2012 Bass so we planned to finish

with the leaders. We all put in additional training on cross-fit, running, cycling, pilates sessions and gym programs to ensure we were ready.

This race the 18th George Bass was described by the organisers as having the worst conditions in 40 years. Three legs had their courses changed due to rough seas, gale force winds, 4m waves and two race days had very strong gale force winds and very rough conditions. Sadly very different conditions to rowing on the lake in Canberra. In my 5 previous Bass' races I have had only one day like any of these for this Bass. These conditions were a huge test for the girls and BATS rowing technique, resilience, fitness and endurance.

The highlight leading up to the Bass was the planning stage were the logistics and support organisers Claire Forbes, Kat Oates, Kat Waterhouse and Pip Butt had us rostered, organised and prepared. "Fuzz" Peter McKay met us on the beach for IRB training with a big smile as usual and with John Granich for crew set to get the girls into and out of the IRB efficiently despite their needs for "special swim" times.

Overall we finished equal second on points with combined Moruya/Met Caloundra and got silver medals and second prize money. A huge effort by everyone, in and out of the crew and a great result for the Capitals.

In the interest of the team's health and safety, Darren Reidy made a vital call on the first day not to race in such wild and rough conditions; it was a decision that proved to positively affect the team for the rest of the week.

Overall the BATS were silver medallists, a fantastic effort by a crew of ladies whose ages range from 41 to 57, a mixture of experience and athleticism and whose main goal was to complete the race unscathed! Of course we trained but unless there was coffee to be had at the end of each session, then that's all that mattered!!

This was Darren Reidy's first Bass as a sweep. The BATS would sincerely like to thank Darren for firstly taking us on, but also for getting us prepared for this great race. Darren's calm manner and lame jokes helped us throughout many training sessions.



The NSW State titles were held in Umina this year in relatively flat conditions. Darren Browning, Darren Phillips and Scott Elliott all competed making a number of finals.





# Broulee Surfers Surf Life Saving Club Inc For the year ended 30 April 2014

### 1. Statement of Significant Policies

The directors' have prepared the financial statements on the basis that the company is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial reports. This financial report is therefore a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in order to meet the needs of members.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below which the directors have determined are appropriate to meet the needs of members. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of this report are as follows:

### 1.(a) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in, first-out basis and include direct materials, direct labour and an appropriate proportion of variable and fixed overhead expenses.

### 1.(b) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost, independent or directors' valuation. All assets, excluding freehold land and buildings, are depreciated over their useful lives to the company.

Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are credited to a revaluation reserve in shareholders' equity. Decreases that offset previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves directly in equity; all other decreases are charged to the profit and loss. Each year the difference between depreciation based on the revalued carrying amount of the asset charged to the profit and loss and depreciation based on the asset's original cost is transferred from the revaluation reserve to retained earnings. The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the asset's employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted in determining recoverable amounts.

### 1.(c) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

### 1.(d) Trade Receivables and Other Receivables

Trade receivables and other receivables, including distributions receivable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money. If required a provision for doubtful has been created.

### 1.(e) Trade Creditors and Other Payables

Trade creditors and other payables, including bank borrowings and distributions payable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money.

### 1.(f) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue. Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which, for floating rate financial assets, is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Revenue recognition relating to the provision of services is determined with reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at reporting date and where outcome of the contract can be estimated reliably. Stage of completion is determined with reference to the services performed to date as a percentage of total anticipated services to be performed. Where the outcome cannot be estimated reliably, revenue is recognised only to the extent that related expenditure is recoverable.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).
