Presidents Report 2015-2016

The 2015-2016 year has been one of significant achievements for Broulee SSLSC. These are not the result of just a few but rather the product of many people working together. This year we had 423 financial members which included 187 patrolling members and 142 Nippers.

Patrols

Our patrollers contributed a total of 5380 hours keeping our beach safe for the local community and visitors. Patrols are the Club's prime function and this year saw over 24,000 people use our beach.

Patrols conducted;

- 110 rescues
- 37 first aid
- 357 preventative actions
- 1 person required CPR
- 3 people required an ambulance

In addition, the callout crew also responded to several incidents in the area. Without the commitment of members to be on patrol we would be unable to fulfil this role. Thankyou to all patrollers but especially to the patrol captains who accept the responsibility of ensuring patrols are conducted in an efficient and correct manner. Those who attended 100% of their rostered patrols also deserve a special thanks. Well done to all.

Trainers and Assessors

Trainers and assessors, along with some designated helpers completed 423 proficiencies or skills updates. This also included 197 nipper proficiencies.

There were 257 new awards attained by our members. This included 111 nipper awards.

Training, assessing and the annual proficiencies consumes a lot of time and effort and this task has been handled by a relatively small group. Special thanks go to Mick Lambert, Peter Halpin, Kel Pearce, Gary Pettigrove, Diego Carrasco, Gary Robbins and Shane Madden for their skill, dedication and organisation.

Competitions

Again Broulee has retained both the Jack Beale Trophy for senior competition and the Dave Pheeneey Trophy for Nippers competition. There have been some outstanding individual competitors who have achieved a high level of success by gaining medals at NSW Country Championships. There have also been a large number of competitors who have also gained points by just attending carnivals and competing.

The rowers have had a successful season in competition. The under 19 girls were placed 5th in the ASRL Open. The BATS were placed second in the Vet Womens category of the George Bass Marathon. The Capitals were also second in the Open Womens category of the George Bass Marathon and also achieved the fastest overall time for the event in their category. They were also the Open Ladies Branch Champions.

Member Service Programs

During the season, SLSA and SLSNSW have run several member programs designed to enhance the skills of the members who are lucky enough to attend. We have been fortunate to have our members attend some of these events. Annabelle Smith was awarded the Far South Coast Branch Nipper of the Year and attended the Junior Lifesaver of the Year Camp. Madeline Grayson attended the Youth Opportunity Makers Workshop, Sam Law was a presenter at the Beach to Bush program and Kirsty Campbell attended the National Masterclass.

Nippers

Once again, Scott (and Simone) Elliott have coordinated our large nipper program. They, along with our dedicated Age Managers and Water Safety helpers are to be congratulated for efficiently running another very successful season.

Cadets

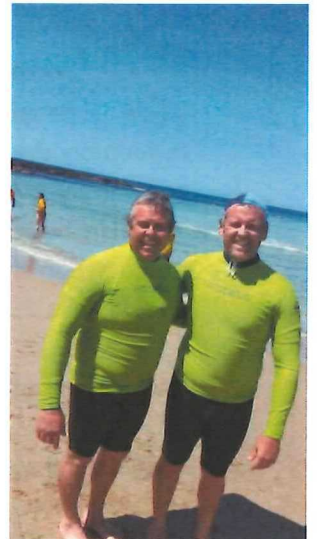
This season Garry and Jamie Griffiths organised the Cadet program. They had a large group of young patrolling members that took part in Branch courses and gatherings with other Clubs as well as training on Sundays. They all achieved great results at our senior carnivals as a result. Well done to the Griffiths brothers for keeping this age group active when other Clubs are seeing huge drop offs in cadet membership.

Hotondo Homes Bay to Breakers Ocean Swim

Again this very successful event was held in early March. There were over 260 swimmers which was well up on numbers from the previous year. Perfect conditions resulted in some very quick times. The introduction of a shorter course for juniors and a category for those wearing flippers also helped in boosting participation. This was the 5th time the event has been held. Many thanks to the organising committee chaired by Gary Pettigrove and also to the Broulee Mossy Point Community Association for their help in staging this event.

The Sunday Swim

Another highlight of our year has been the summer series Sunday swim. This has been hotly contested and has drawn up to 50 swimmers. All have enjoyed the challenge, the competition and also the chance to mix socially. This series is largely the work of Barb and Geoff Wells. They have set the cans, done the risk assessments, recorded the times and adjusted the handicaps. Your efforts are greatly appreciated.



Fund Raising

To run a club like ours requires a lot of money. We receive grants for buildings and equipment, sponsorship from the Tomakin Sports and Social Club, support from the Eurobodalla Shire Council and from SLSNSW.

However, we also rely on income from member's fees, income from the bar and other events such as the annual door knock. Thanks to all those who have assisted in these fund raisers as your efforts do make a significant difference.

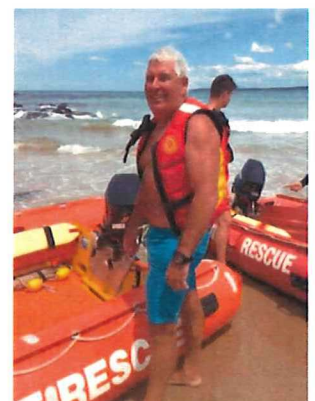

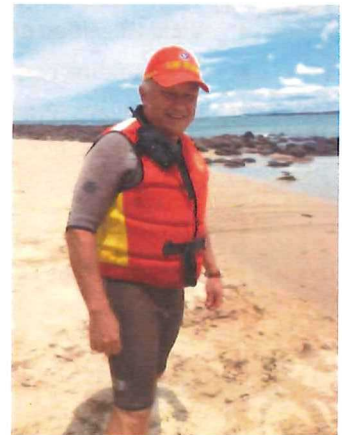
The club executive however, deserves special mention. This group handles a huge level of responsibility and have all performed their roles in an exemplary manner.

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Club Captains Report 2015/16



2015/16 has been another very successful season. This season for our 8 patrols I have logged into Surf Guard 5781.50 hours. These hours have been spent on our beach volunteering for regular Patrols and also Water safety. We have had no major incidents this season, and this is something we should all be proud of, and a reflection of the time that we put into keeping up our skills and training. This season we performed 365 preventions, searched for 3 lost children and performed 38 major first aids. On 5 occasions this season our Patrol Captains closed the beach.

This season there were 49 100% Patrollers, and five of these people were also awarded a 5 year 100% award. To obtain 100% patrol these members have fulfilled 100% of their patrol hours. This means finding a replacement for their patrol if they can't attend and making those hours up elsewhere. This just shows the commitment that the members of Broulee have to their club and to keeping our beaches safe.



I aim this coming season, with the assistance of our trainers and assessors to continue trying to get as many patrollers as possible gaining more awards and up skilling so that we can have the most effective patrols that we can. Keep an eye out for any upcoming courses in our weekly notices.

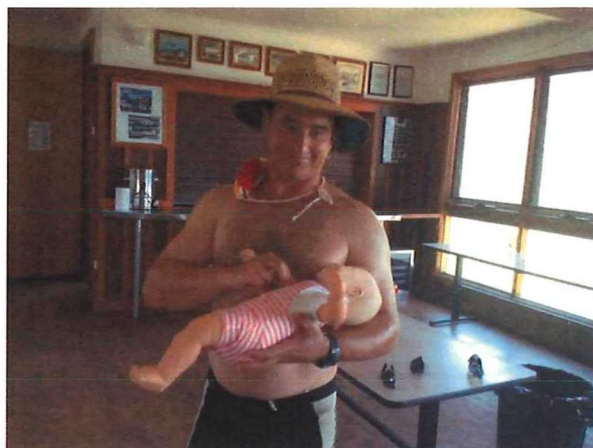
Broulee continues to be a strong and motivated club with dedicated members. I look forward to an exciting 2016/17 season.

Broulee Surf Boat Section Annual Report

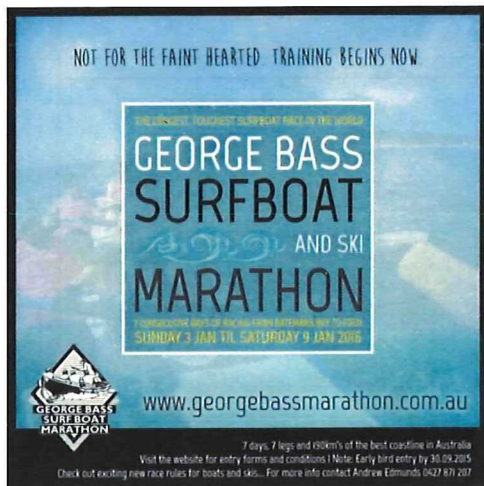
The Surfboat section had a brilliant year again with strong results in a range of events. The Club had 5 crews compete during the season. Each crew was coached and swept by a qualified person.

Thanks to the following sweeps for their time and efforts Darren Reidy (BATS), Rob Pollock (Under 19 and Reserves), Gus MacDonald and Tony Dale for training and social rowing sessions and Gary Pettigrove (Open Women and Masters Vets).

The highlights of the season for surf boats include:

- The Broulee **under 19 girls** crew swept by Rob Pollock consisting of **Violetta Favaloro, Allana O'Fee, Aralai Anuyahong and Aisha Smith** in the first ever official surfboat race for Under 19 Girls, made the final of the ASRL Open carnival and finished a credible fifth. They only got their life saving bronze medallions finalised the week before this event. The girls trained hard in the boat over the summer and were pleased with their efforts. Congratulations ladies.
- Broulee had two crews in the **19th George Bass Surfboat Marathon** raced over 180km from Batemans Bay to Eden.
 - The Broulee Capitals Open women raced the fastest overall time and came in second place on leg points. **The crew were Nikki Ayers, Elice Stanley, Sally McReady, Vikki Fischer, Jacinta Williams, Jackie Jones, Claire Forbes, Harriet Walker, Aimee Minns** and swept by Gary Pettigrove. A great reward for months of hard work including a Leg win on the toughest and hardest race day and second place on every other leg.
 - The Broulee Bats vets women's **George Bass surfboat** crew came second in their division. A magnificent effort and result for a nice group of maturing ladies. The crew consisted of **Sue Dale, Gabi Smith, Melissa Clarke, Kimberli Eke, Kerryl Davies, Narelle Pollock, Michelle Zutt, Donna Clarke** and swept by Darren Reidy. A consistent effort for their second Bass in a row where they came second on every day except the last leg where they came third. Well done ladies.
- The Broulee **Reserves crew** of **Roy Booker, Hugo DuToit, Hayden Connor, Rolland Halligan** and swept by Rob Pollock attended two events this season. They had the experience of a life time competing in 3 m waves at Manly beach in the biggest and cleanest waves all season. This event had some cracking TV coverage but unfortunately when a wave this large takes you under, it is the end of the day and the boat goes back on the trailer.
- The **Broulee Vets** in their first ever season after getting their Bronze medallions in November, travelled to most events and competed in fine style. The crew of **Pete Shaw, Stephen Moore, Jeff Dunne, Morgan Freemantle** and swept by Gary Pettigrove, won a third place Bronze medal in the final of the ASRL Masters Over 160. It bought huge smiles to their faces after the final race. Congratulations Vets. They won the Branch championships for masters and came second overall in the 4 carnival South Coast Boat series. At their first Australian Masters Championships the Vets finished seventh and just missed the Over 160s final by a slim margin.
- The Canberra Men's crew of **Tim Dawson, Martin Vant, Mark Ta'ufo'ou, James Flick** and swept by Gary Pettigrove competed at the branch championships at Narooma to finish in third place in the open men's division. The crew had attempts to compete this season after entering a range of events and making it to two branch carnivals.
- The **Broulee Capitals open women's crew** consisting of **Claire Forbes, Harriett Walker, Jackie Jones, Vikki Fischer, Michelle Edden, Sunny Rutherford, Aimee Minns** and swept by Gary Pettigrove. The crew came first in the Pambula Club to Pub race, first at the Tathra branch carnival and first at the Branch Championships at Narooma where the crew was swept by Claire Forbes, Broulee's first ever female sweep in a race. Two of the under 19 girls Allana and Violetta filled in the open women's Capital crew at the branch championships on the Lake as the surf was 3 m and dumping hard at the Narooma beach.

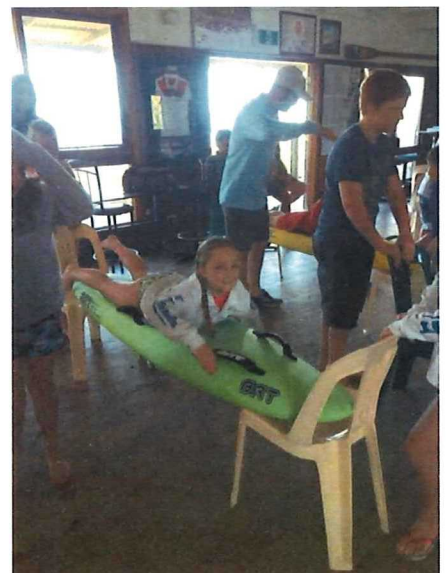

All cadets are now active patrolling members who are all very keen to further there life saving skills which in the up coming season will be attaining there bronze medallion , IRB crewman etc.

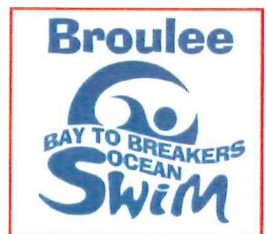

Hotondo Broulee Bay to Breakers Swim Annual Report 2016



The fifth annual Broulee Bay to Breakers Ocean Swim was conducted on Sunday 13 March 2016. This was the first year of our second 3 year contract of the Hotondo sponsorship.

The conditions were perfect for swimming and the water was very clear and warm at 21.9C. The course swum was the normal course. The weather conditions were perfect at 28C and warm. There were 260 swimmers that entered the water. The preregistration was 229 and the walk up registrations on the day was 31 swimmers.

This year we introduced the Under 12 and 14 swim over 500m which had 19 swimmers and a 1.4km flipper swim with 7 swimmers. These changes increased our cohort diversity.

The event was sponsored by Hotondo Homes (Principal Darren Phillips) major sponsorship and we were also supported by a number of local sponsors. Hotondo Homes are in the first year of our second three year major sponsorship agreement.

The organising committee were members from the Broulee Surf Life Saving Club and the Broulee Mossy Point Community Association. The committee all did a fantastic job applying better practice and the lessons learnt from the previous swims to make this a great event.

The swimmer's feedback was excellent again this year.

A **\$7,463.24** profit was made from the event and the allocation of funds split (\$3,500 each) between the Broulee Surf Life Saving Club and the Broulee Mossy Point Community Association. The whole Broulee community were the winners on the day.

- Two new records were set for over 60 Female and Over 70 Male
- 141 swimmers were male and 119 were female and 20 swimmers swam their division and the open.

- 65 swimmers came from Canberra (65 in 2015)
- 72 swimmers came from Broulee, Mossy Point, Moruya and Batemans Bay (2013 was 77)
- Ben Lambert won his first Open Swim and Jane McCallum won her second open Women's swim.

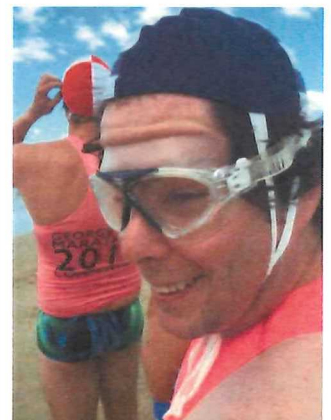
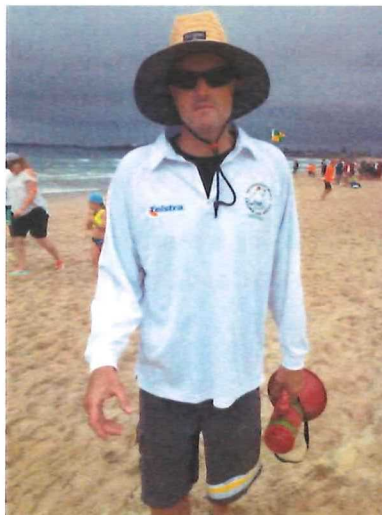
We have had a few members selected to take part in State programs, and we are lucky to have so many members willing to spend their time and learn new skills to benefit our Club in the future.

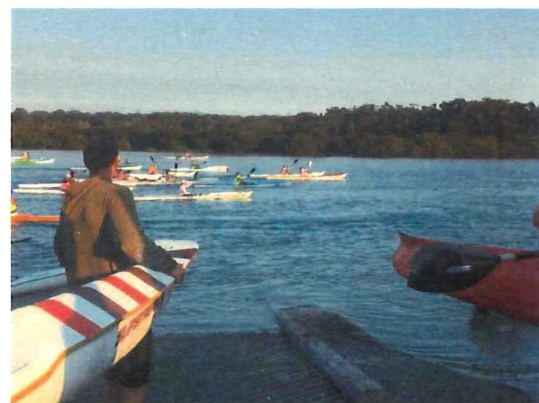
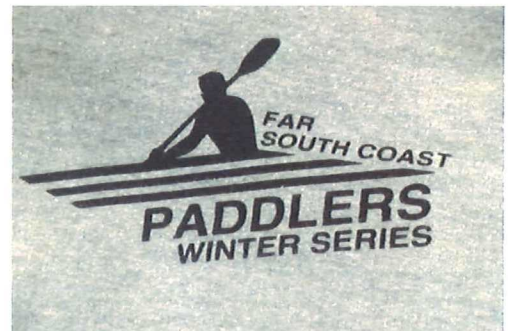




Surf Sports Report 2015/2016

We also had 12 Broulee competitors compete in the Far South Coast Interbranch team up at Forster this season with some improving results.



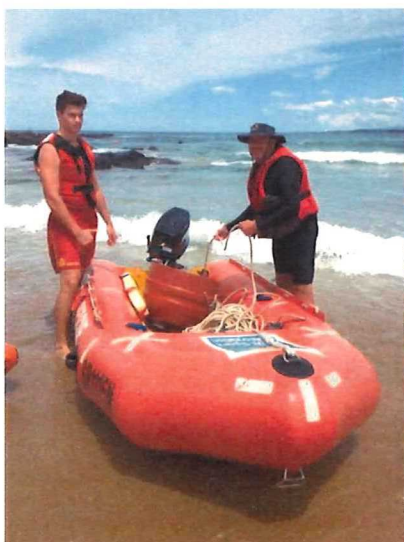

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The association was incorporated 21 October 1988 (Y0616534) under the *Associations Incorporation Act 2009*, NSW. It is registered with the Australian Business Register - Australian Business Number 62 456 466 445. The association is registered for Goods and Services Tax purposes and reports quarterly on a cash basis. The association is income tax exempt under authority from the Australian Taxation Office. It holds an authority to fundraise through Surf Life Saving New South Wales Incorporated (CFN11033) under the provisions of the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and the authority remains in force until 6 May 2019.

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act 2009* as above and *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) *Fixed Assets*

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Donated assets are brought to account at fair value at the date of acquisition.

(b) *Inventories*

All inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. The "First In First Out" method has been used to assign cost to individual items of stock.

We also report that:


