## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

We are a "Can Do" Club, delivering quality services.

This season we opened our newly renovated and extended Clubhouse and completed our 100% patrol efficiency commitment. I am pleased that no lives were lost on our beach during the patrol hours for our season. Our 11<sup>th</sup> Bay to Breakers Ocean swim was very successful. Our two nipper programs were managed in an excellent manner and delivered skills, fun and enjoyment. We conducted three surf sports carnivals on our beach.



The South Coast Surf Boat Series, the FSC Branch Carnivals and the NSW Sharkskin IRB racing round 3. We hosted the ALBERT advanced IRB course for the Branch on our beach and further developed our surf sports program with 10 Broulee members and in Aussie Finals.



Our Call Out Crew were very busy this season with a large increase in incidents along our nearby coastline. The club thanks the call out team for their diligence and prompt services.

This patrol season started in October 2021 and was impacted by COVID with our Canberra members unable to travel to the coast due to pandemic lockdowns. Thank you to the Broulee locals for picking up all the early patrols for the club. I congratulate our Club Captain Scott Kemmis and our 8 Patrol

captains for the excellent manner the patrols were conducted and providing a safe swimming and surfing location for the public. A huge thank you to our 130 diligent patrol members who attended during the season.

We held the two-day South Coast Surfboat series in November in tough conditions. Our masters men's and women's surfboat crews won their division on the day. We hosted the FSC Nipper carnival at North Broulee due to the large winds and surf on our beach and co-hosted the FSC senior carnival with Moruya at North Broulee on the same weekend. Our surf sports team was reduced by COVID lockdowns at these events.



The FSC Jack Beal Surf Sports trophy for FSC clubs overall carnival points score went to Tathra after many years residing at Broulee. Tathra have challenged us to win it back off them next season. The challenge is on, so get training to win "Jack Back".



I congratulate Darren Drewsen for his gold medal in the beach flags and bronze medal in the beach sprint at the Aussie Masters and the Broulee women's masters surfboat crew, Griffin Braves who came 4<sup>th</sup> in their final. Well done to all our young surf sports competitors who made the top 10 and finals in their events.

The 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Hotondo Bay to Breakers Ocean Swim was well attended this year. Thank you to the Swim committee lead by David and Rosemary Butt on delivery of an event to be very proud off. Thank you to the members who helped on the swim day and provided water safety. We could not do it without you. The swim committee also won the FSC

Services Team of the Year award. Congratulations Bay to Breakers Team. The club thanks Hotondo Homes and owner Darren Phillips for their 10 years of sponsorship and support for our fantastic ocean swim.

The NSW IRB racing round 3 at Broulee was a huge success. We set a benchmark in service quality and the weekend was enjoyed by all. Thank you to Andrew Edmunds and the Event committee and all our volunteers who gave their time freely to make this event special. It was great to see the clubhouse pumping three nights in a row.

A special thank you to David Butt for his efforts this year to empty the container of surplus building materials, to build the Changeroom stools and coat hooks and assisted with the strategic plan projects. Your advice and volunteer input is appreciated.



The clubhouse opened formally on 4 December by Andrew Constance our NSW MP and Fiona Phillips our Federal MP. I thank Peter and Lee Louttit for building us a magnificent clubhouse and for their personal contribution for their improvements to the clubhouse. In recognition of their generosity, we have named



"Pete's Corner" near the bar. We received sponsorship from Solar Hub for the supply and installation of a 11KW solar panel system. Thank you to Benn and Luke for your generous donation to our Club. A huge thank you to the building committee chaired by Allan Veness for their efforts and project







#### Junior Achiever of the Year - Cameron Cox

Cameron Cox. Cameron is a keen member of Patrol 1. This year for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year running he has completed 100 percent of his patrols. This year Cameron was selected as leader at the Far South Coast Branch development program Wambiri, having been a participant in the previous season. Congratulations Cameron.

Isabella completed her IRB crew certificate this year, adding to her Surf Rescue Certificate she obtained last year. The Griffin Braves came first in the South Coast Boat Series, Undefeated in four rounds and in every heat. Finished fourth at the Australian Championships at Kirra. Qualified 3<sup>rd</sup> place after the round robin and was on the same wave as the crews who ended up finishing in second and third place, narrowly finishing in fourth.

- 1. Male and Female Change rooms and showers
- 2. New First Aid expanded room with ambulance access
- 3. Extension of the hall some 9 meters to the south
- 4. Expand the bar to accommodate external functions and club social and presentation events
- 5. Add on a third storey Patrol room for beach observation and communication
- 6. Include a café to lease to an external provider
- 7. Upgrade to a commercial kitchen
- 8. Relocate the Boutique
- 9. Upgrade to the fire alarm and fire protection

The project team reported to the club committee on a monthly basis.

#### **Building variations**

A number of building variations from the original tender works were approved during the project.

#### These included:

- I. A canter levered deck corner so not to impact the surrounding bush
- II. A larger patrol room space for beach operations and patrol member support
- III. Concreting in front of the first aid room
- IV. Landscaping outside of the café area
- V. Installation of the cool room
- VI. The fire alarm, additional fire protection and fire pump to align with the building code for a public building of this size
- VII. Solar Panel installation
- VIII. Financial Support for the Café Range hood installation

#### **Crown Land Lease and Licence**

In 2021, the Broulee Club and Eurobodalla Shire reached lease agreement on a crown land for the clubhouse and gear shed. This crown lease applies a Crown licence for the first 5 years and rolls over to a lease for the period of 21 years. The income from the Café sub-lease is retained in the Clubs Building Maintenance Account to be used for that purpose. An annual meeting with the Shire is conducted to discuss the lease and the use of these building maintenance funds to maintain the buildings.

#### **Project Expenditure**

The total project building cost was \$1,260,000 which was aligned to the Club's budget and grant funding.

#### BROULEE SURFERS SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB

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The builder, P&L Louttit Total Constructions made a significant in-kind contribution to the project that enhanced the quality and outcomes for members. We very much thank Peter and Lee for their personal contribution and design advice.

#### **Outcomes**

- I. The official occupancy certificate was approved by the Building Certifier in November 2021.
- II. The clubhouse was a quality building and delivered within the total revised budget.
- III. The traditional look and feel was maintained.
- IV. The Male and Female showers and change rooms a provide a facility not available previously to our members. The Commonwealth grant provided facilities for our female members who were disadvantaged in our previous clubhouse.
- V. The bar is significant and supports our fundraising and social operations.
- VI. The grant reconciliation is complete.
- VII. The café is operational but still to achieve its full menu and services.
- VIII. The collaboration between the project manager and the builder was a significant contribution to the quality and on budget outcomes.
- IX. The Club house is there for all to use. The feedback from external guests and members has been very pleasing. Utilisation rates are high over the summer period.

#### **Opening**

The Clubhouse was officially opened on Sunday 4 December 2021 by Hon Andrew Constance NSE MP, Fiona Phillips Commonwealth MP and the opening was attended by Steve Pearce CEO Surf Life Saving NSW.

#### **Lessons Learned**

- The Tender released would have been better if it had more detailed specifications. It would have been easier to compare and evaluate responses from tenders
- The Development Approval (DA) should have been approved before going to market with the tender. Would have removed a 5-month delay in starting the building stage of the project.
- The building code alignment based on the DA required additional cost items and services that
  were not originally budgeted for. These include the Fire Panel, internal fire proofing between
  floors and external Fire Pump.
- We engaged a cleaning contractor for up to 3 hours per week to maintain the club and to clean after functions where required. Funding for the cleaning comes from the building maintenance fund.



#### **BROULEE NIPPERS REPORT**



Broulee Nippers season 2021/22 had solid numbers of registrations, with 135 registered nippers slightly down from 145 last season, in challenging times the support remained strong overall.

Outside of the season's challenges, the Broulee Nippers extended themselves in

all surf sports disciplines, and tackled the first aid aspects in training for their SRC qualifications. Sixteen under 14's completed their SRC this season. It is without any doubt that the training these Nippers participate in will give them the absolute ability to one day save a life or assist in such a way to change a life with these water and beach skills they learn. It just so happens to also be a lot of fun along the way with the opportunity to compete and represent themselves and their club in all these disciplines learnt.

This season started quite suddenly at the end of October as the nation transitioned back to socially normal activities again. And the La Nina also played a few tricks also, with quite unstable weather conditions contributing the seven training sessions at North Broulee and seven sessions at



South Broulee. Participation remained strong even when the weather played foul. Highlights of this season training sessions would have to be the bigger wave sessions at North and South Broulee, and some big ocean swim days in the beach rips at South. The Nippers are a very strong bunch of juniors!

Sand events were unaffected by the preceding week's storms, and all events were well populated with Broulee caps.



Second carnival was a carnival to remember, what a busy fun filled event at North Broulee for the FSC Branch junior carnival. The weather held out for 121 strong field of Broulee competitors and solid participation from Moruya, Pambula, Tathra, and Narooma Nippers. A consistent wave developed on the rising tide throughout the morning, which allowed plenty of firm sand for the early beach events to begin and flow seamlessly. The beach run first up had great

numbers as the age groups staggered through before combining the 13s and 14s for the long flag of 1km. Flags and sprints had some challenging fresh grooms of medium and soft packed sand at North to contend with, and both areas had full pits and good sports to fill them. The water was where the new PB's began to develop, as with a bit of home ground advantage, the swim string had the spectators squinting for focus before the legs hit the sand bank for the sprint to the line in some big-hearted finishes. It's always exciting when the board legs start when there is a wave in the course, the U14s

always manage to impress as the 'Oohs' and 'Ahhs' from the sand builds as monster drop ins and the occasional nosedive raise the tone of the beach noise. Overall, a great day from team Broulee, and not overshadowing the efforts of the athletes of the day, but a big thank you to all whom helped on the day, before the day, in or out of the water, thank



you! Broulee played a perfect host for the carnival event. Great effort everyone!

The Broulee Nippers team travelled to Narooma Beach for the Branch Championships and final local carnival for the season. Almost 70 competitors competed in the final branch Nippers carnival of the season, showcasing months of training. Well done Broulee, you shone with outstanding sportsmanship, camaraderie, and spirit to achieve your personal bests and it was a great team result for the day. The team was missing almost 40 competitors though from the "Isolation lurgy" which was also mirrored in every participating club's team on the day. entrants all the way in, in every race. And how cool were the 13s, holding their nerve in the swim, whilst a resident competitive seal played dodgem with the front runners - to the beach and back out again, and again, and you get the picture... Mind you, the seal visited most of the age groups at least once in the water swims, and in the clear water, was also very well monitored from the shore and the Water Safety in the drink.

Aidan Tyrrell: Participated in the Flags.


Amelia Tyrrell: Silver Medal in the Flags and a finalist in the Sprint

## HOTONDO HOMES BAY TO BREAKERS OCEAN SWIM



The eleventh annual Broulee Bay to Breakers Ocean Swim was conducted on Sunday 13 March 2022. After a summer impacted by the pandemic and wild weather conditions, the 11<sup>th</sup> swim was successfully managed on North Broulee Beach with 333 swimmers. The event had 376 registered swimmers but COVID prevented some from participating.

Risk management was key in the assessment to conduct this swim. Wild storms and heavy rain flushed trees, logs, sticks and mulch from the Moruya River and Candalgan Creek into the Broulee ocean waters. The normal course from Shark Bay to Broulee Beach was assessed to have a high risk due to the floating logs and the amount of debris on Broulee Beach. The event was moved to North Broulee Bay for the safety of the swimmers and to remain within the event's risk tolerance. The North Broulee water was slightly turbid, calm with a small wave and the water was at 22.2C. The weather conditions were good at 26C, warm with little wind on the North Broulee swim course. Swim registration was closed one week prior to the swim and there were no walk-up registrations on the day. This made the administration simpler.



The seventh year of the Under 12 and 14 swim over 500m was also conducted at North Broulee with 29 swimmers and for the second year Novice Swimmers joined in.

The event was sponsored by Hotondo Homes (Principal Darren Phillips) as the major sponsor, and was supported by a small number of local sponsors. Hotondo Homes are in the first year of their next five-year major sponsorship agreement.

#### BROULEE SURFERS SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB

#### **ANNUAL REPORT 2021-22**

The swim committee did a fantastic job applying better practice and lessons learnt from previous swims to make this a better event. David and Rosemary Butt were the Swim Directors and their efforts were



industrious and innovative. The timing system was managed and controlled by Ted Pettigrove. Several successful test sessions were undertaken throughout January. The event results were available a few minutes after the last swimmer crossed the line. The swimmers' feedback was very positive again this year.

Profit made from the event was \$6,000 for the Broulee Surf Life Saving Club. Broulee

Surfers SLSC then donated \$1000 to Broulee Mossy Point Community Association and a donation to the sailing club for use of their buoys.

#### **EVENT FACTS AND HIGHLIGHTS**

- Naming sponsorship from Hotondo Homes and their logistics party were brilliant. An excellent relationship has been established with benefits to both parties. The finish area and the archway looked professional and worked well for swimmers.
- 336 swimmers entered the water.
- Single Age group waves of single gender were the norm for this swim and worked well.
- 172 swimmers were male and 161 were female.
- The Over 50 age division had 71 swimmers and Over 40 had 51 swimmers
- 79 swimmers came from Broulee, Mossy Point, Moruya and Batemans Bay. Over 200 came from Canberra
- Alec Morris won his first Open Men's Swim and Jordyne Rauter won her first open Women's swim.

### Summary of significant accounting policies

The association was incorporated 21 October 1988 (Y0616534) under the Associations Incorporation Act 2009, NSW as a Not for Profit Entity. It is registered with the Australian Business Register - Australian Business Number 62 456 466 445. The association is registered for Goods and Services Tax purposes and reports quarterly on a cash basis. The association is income tax exempt under authority from the Australian Taxation Office. It holds an authority to fundraise through Surf Life Saving New South Wales incorporated (CFN11033) under the provisions of the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and the authority remains in force until 6 May 2024.

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 2009 as above and Australian Charifies and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Additional Disclosures.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

#### (a) Property, plant and equipment

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Donated assets are brought to account at fair value at

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

#### (b) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and is net of any rebates and discounts received. Net realisable value is estimated using the most reliable evidence available at the reporting date and inventory is written down through an obsolescence provision if necessary.

## 2 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The committee make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances. These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates. There are no areas that involve a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements other than those described in the accounting policies.

## 3 Key Management Personnel and Related Party Disclosures

The committee and volunteers did not receive any remuneration from the association during the year other than reimbursement of out of pocket expenses that have been fully substantiated. There were no related party transactions with the committee during the financial year.
