overing the activities of the Club and its Members for the 1995/96 Season, this 17th Annual Report and Balance Sheet is submitted to you for your consideration and adoption at the forthcoming Seventeenth Annual General Meeting of the Club.

The Club is proud to report that, once again, "No Lives Have Been Lost Whilst Patrols Have Been on Duty". The Club extends its appreciation to those members who honoured their Patrol obligations. Unfortunately there were some serious lapses with Patrols and it was the efforts of members performing volunteer Patrols that assisted the Club in its commitment to those using the surf at Broulee.

Some Members seemed unprepared to attend rostered Patrols and potentially leave their Patrol undermanned. Members are reminded that their entry into major competition is dependent upon the number of rostered hours completed each year between January 1st and December 31st. Members who have not met the requirements will not be entered for any major carnivals.

FINANCE

Club finances which are in a satisfactory position, the overdraft with the Commonwealth Bank, Moruya negotiated near the end of last Season to complete new facilities in the Clubhouse has been paid back. The Club has financial commitments to meet with improvements to facilities downstairs and with bringing the Club up to fire safety standards.

Secretary's Report Continued...

We are grateful to the Department of Sport and Recreation for a grant of \$5 000 on a \$ for \$ basis to assist with Meeting the costs associated with this project for a further \$ for \$ Grant of \$1 875 for the refurbishment of our Zodiac IRB and the purchase of a new engine.

The Bar Facilities, reported on last year have been a welcome source of finance to meet the day by day running costs of the Club. These facilities will not solve the financial problems of the Club nor will they do any more than they have over the past year unless more and varied use of the facilities are made by the Club and its members.

Many thanks to our Treasurer Kerri Hall who assumed these duties in the early part of the Season.

NEW FACILITIES

A complete refurbishment of the downstairs section of the Clubhouse is currently underway. The showers have been converted into cubicle style units, the coolroom and other plant is now contained in a separate room and provision is being made for a Club Common Room and a new members' kitchen. These facilities will hopefully be completed in the very near future.

The running of the bar has been responsibility of our House Captain, John Hall who has done an excellent job over the entire year.

A total of 18 Association Awards were gained by the Club during the year. Congratulations to those successful candidates and many thanks to our Chief Instructor, John Gale.

Drivers should keep a distance of 18M (50ft) from the flagged areas at all times unless in a rescue situation.

Finally, the long voyage was undertaken to Kurrawa on the Gold Coast for the Australian Titles. After long drives and flights no-one was prepared for the tragic weekend that was about to unfold. All were greeted by huge seas. The first day of competition was shifted from one beach to another and so on before being postponed. Saturday came and a cut-throat day of competition with many casualties. The Reserve crew looked as if they had made it out but the waves had other plans. Broulee 'Bert' followed closely in the Open, challenging the ocean and coming off second best. After being hit by several waves, the stern of the boat decided it didn't want to any further part and so left the crew to fend for themselves. It really was a long swim home. Broulee 'George' fared much better and full credit goes to them for a great achievement in reaching the quarter-finals in such trying and testing conditions. Congratulations to Jason and the boys. What did the cans look like?

First Aid Report ■

he First Aid and Patrol Officers experienced a very busy and successful 1995-96 Surf Life Saving Season. If the Season is to be remembered for one thing it must be the abundance of jellyfish and marine stingers. Unfortunately those who ventured into the briny during the week over Christmas found the water to be much less than inviting.

A total of sixty five cases of marine stings were recorded as requiring treatment over the Season. Thirty of these cases were on Boxing Day alone. The patrol officers who were on duty during the worst 'stinger days' certainly gained plenty of experience in treating large numbers of people, some with severe marine stings.

Seventeen cases were documented in the Club Log Book as requiring minor first aid. Many of these cases were due to cuts and abrasions. Unfortunately one major case of first aid occurred this season. The patient required ambulance transfer to hospital for treatment and admission. I am happy to report that this resulted in a successful outcome and an uncomplicated recovery.

With renovations to the upstairs sections of the Clubhouse almost complete, the work focus has shifted downstairs. External doors and access from the beach to the First Aid Room have already been greatly improved. In the planning for renovations downstairs, some additional space may be gained for the First Aid Room. With all going to plan, improvements to the treatment area and facilities could be completed and ready for the 1996-97 Season.

Thank-you to all Club Members, Committee Members and supporters for your work and assistance with First Aid this Season.

Gear Steward's Report

Club Equipment

Flags - Beach Patrol: Two, condition good, faded slightly, may need replacement during 1996/97 season.

Patrol Area - good condition.

Rescue Tubes - Five, condition good; two red tubes, condition fair.

Beach Signs - 'Bathe Between the Flags', 'Area Closed (Competition)', 'Board & Wave Ski Area', 2 x 'Do the Right Thing'.

These signs are not being utilised to their advisory capacity - let's get with it members - communication is the word for 1996/97.

Paddles - one Danish style blades and two others I'd rather not talk about.

Skis - six, two Burtons, two Pratts, one I donated as a learning ski and one Jeffreys.

Boards - Malibu Racing Boards, three; Rescue Boards, two, plus two new rescue boards being held in reserve and additionally Emerald rescue board revamped.

Nipper Boards - 8 foam/glass; 5 SLSA coolite.

embers - it's imperative that when a board / ski (and this includes Nipper gear) is damaged it is reported immediately and taken out of service for repairs. The longer damaged equipment is subjected to use, the more damage is done. The equipment takes on weight, in the case of boards, the foam becomes saturated, the glass lifts and a bubbling effect becomes prominent, altering the shape of the running surface of the board resulting in the board becoming useless for competition/rescue (slower in the water).

Skis, there is a similar result, whilst there's very little loss of shape, it's the weight of the craft that increases. The craft can be drained and dries out but there is still salt deposits inside the ski. Humidity moistens these salt deposits and when the bung is removed, damage occurs.

The 1995/96 Season saw a slight improvement in the 'ding' department, which was very pleasing and whilst I'm not intending to retire - yet - I don't want to be working like a one armed paper hanger!

Thanks John and Nick, without your efforts (and your band of regular co-opted helpers) it would not be possible.


Successful applications by the Secretary for grants, Capital Assistance and Dollar for Dollar, further add to our club assets, (as does the care of our caretaker).
